A RESOLUTION

1 Urging the President and Congress of the United States to fully
2 fund the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.

3 WHEREAS, In 1975 the Congress of the United States enacted
4 the Education of the Handicapped Act, now known as the
5 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (Public Law 91-230,
6 20 U.S.C. § 1400 et seq.), to ensure that all children with
7 disabilities in the United States have available to them a free
8 and appropriate public education that emphasizes special
9 education and related services designed to meet their unique
10 needs, to ensure that the rights of children with disabilities
11 and their parents or guardians are protected, to assist states
12 and localities in providing for the education of all children
